UNSHAKEABLE: CONFESSING PRAYER

SCRIPTURE

1 John 1:5-2:2

OVERVIEW

Sin likes to hide in the shadows and too often we try to keep things hidden from God, as though he couldn't see them! When we fall into this mind-set we may still pray, but not as we should, addressing the things in our heart that do not honour Him. God wants us to be real and honest with him. He is faithful even when we are not. Jesus' blood has the power to cleanse us from all unrighteousness but the Bible is clear that we need to confess and repent of our sin. The Bible paints a stark picture between those who confess and those who cover up. Cain covered up, Joseph brothers covered up, Saul covered up and Judas covered up. Whereas by contrast Jacob confessed, David confessed, and Peter confessed. Who would you rather be like?
