- 3. 'The gospel promotes a 'can't do' attitude'. What do you understand by that and why is it good news?
- 4. 'Self-sufficiency is like rowing a boat without a sail when the wind is blowing'. How could we be more responsive the moving of the Holy Spirit in our lives?
