# Dependency embraces the shadows

### **Outline**

On Sunday we looked at part 7 of our Divine Yet Dependent series looking at how dependency embraces the shadows. We saw through the passage we read that John the Baptist was a man who was willing to see different seasons of life come his way. As God moved him from a time of obvious fruitfulness and success into a time of moving into the background as Jesus began his ministry. John was able to embrace this well because of three reasons. Firstly because he was a man who recognised all the credit for anything good in his life is because of God. He saw himself as a courier who simply had what was given to him rather than a creator. Secondly John was able to embrace the shadows because he knew his capacity, recognising that his role was to prepare the way not be the way. John knew he was a small cog in God's plans, not the solution. Finally we saw that John could be dependent on God and embrace a season of obscurity because his life was centred on Christ. He knew he wasn't the 'starring role' but rather a 'silent extra' with the joy of knowing and hearing the voice of God.
