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SCRIPTURE

Revelation 3:1-6

SCRIPTURE CONTEXT

The fifth letter is to the church in Sardis, one of the oldest cities in Asia. The city had once had much fame and wealth but now found its identity and reputation in that past, and the church reflected that too: it had a reputation of being alive, but had faded. We see that Jesus has no positive words to say about her, despite her being celebrated by the words of others. This is an important warning, that the church can begin to set success by worldly standards that bring death, not life in the eyes of God. Jesus cares most about people's hearts, not their works and He knows if we are a people who love God first and foremost and genuinely love those around us, or if it's all a show. The call is to wake up and return to the truth of the gospel. Our hope of moving from death to life is in the power of the Spirit, sent by the risen Christ.
