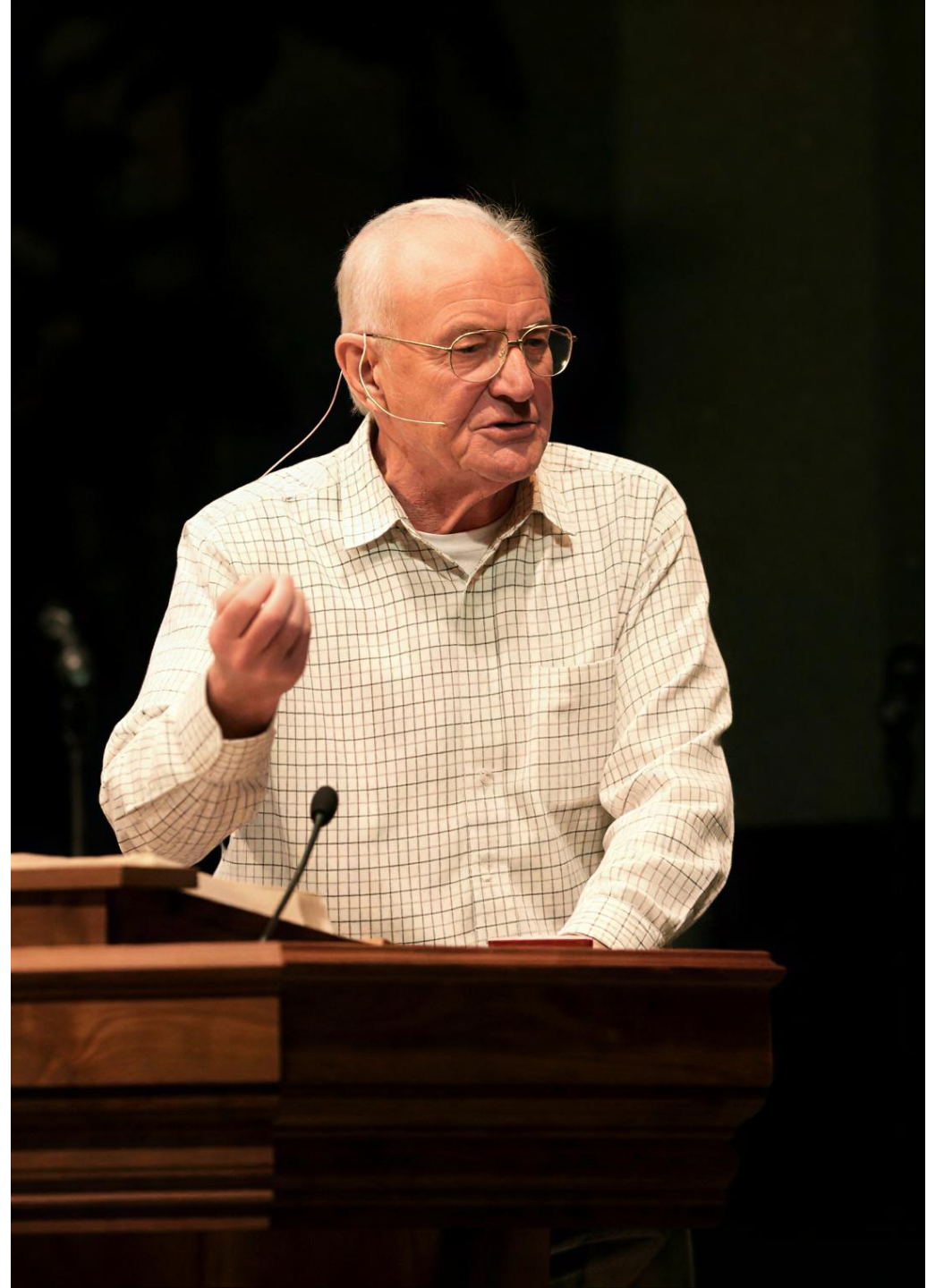


**Since we are so far removed from the

I mean they do not practice NT Ecclesiology.

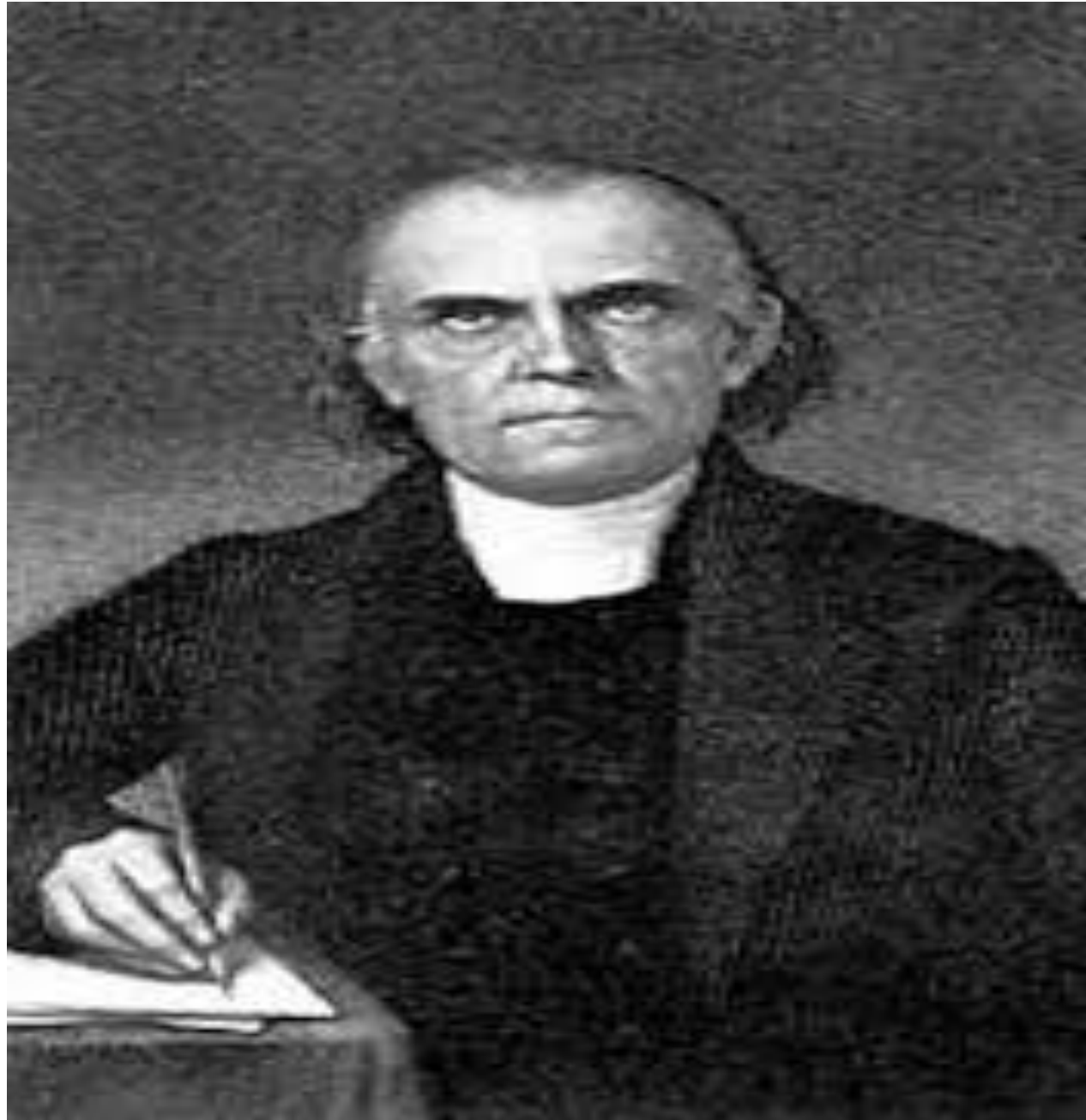
**Our church here is a scriptural church.
