## **The Shepherdless Sheep**



**The “Building Sheep” can be in a good season or a bad season but they understand how the Chief Shepherd and the Under Shepherds work...**

**They “build up” and encourage the flock to stay connected and to keep moving...**

**Whether their in the center or middle or fringes of the flock they are loving those around them, they are following their Shepherds, and they are encouraging others to do the same...**

**The “Neutral Sheep” are good when things are good and they struggle a little more when things are bad...**

**When things are bad though the neutral sheep tend to lose sight of the Chief Shepherd and Under Shepherds so they may actually be heading in the wrong direction BUT they are still in the flock so at the end of the year or the end of the rough season they have still made progress...**

**The key for this neutral sheep is that they are not actively trying to lead others in a direction that is away from the Chief Shepherd or the Under Shepherds...**

**Now the “Undermining Sheep” is another story...**

**They are not just going in the wrong direction at times like the “Neutral Sheep”...**

**They can be going in the right or wrong direction and they can be in the center, middle, or fringes of the flock...**

**The issue isn’t direction or location but intention...**

**The “Undermining Sheep” aren’t interested in following the Under-Shepherds and they are actively trying to create other paths for the other sheep in the flock...**
