Living What We Hear

Big Idea

Listening to God always leads us to live differently.

Psalm 119:129-136

Key Verse for the Week:
Guide my steps by your word, so I will not
be overcome by evil. -Psalm 119:133

Hearing God changes how we live, love, and respond.

- God's Word reshapes our obedience
- God's Word brings clarity to everyday life
- God's Word awakens holy desire

God's Word produces compassion, not pride.

- God's Word reminds us of our need for mercy
- God's Word shapes humble dependence, not self-confidence
- God's Word creates empathy for the oppressed

God loves me and I want to share that love

Listening Questions

- God, what are You shaping in me through Your Word right now?
- Lord, what are You inviting me to desire more deeply?
- God, what are You showing me that I usually rush past?
- Lord, what is my next faithful step?
- God, how do You want my life to reflect what I've heard from You?

Sermon Questions

Icebreaker: Do you have a favorite way to engage with Scripture – reading, listening, highlighting, journaling, or discussing it with others? What makes that way enjoyable for you?

1. Was there a verse, phrase, or question from the sermon or scripture (Psalm 119:129–136) that stayed with you during the week? What made it linger?
2. What do you think are the psalmist's circumstances in this passage (Psalm 119:129–136)?
3. In what ways does the psalmist repeatedly ask God to act? What does this suggest about the attitude required to truly hear God?
4. Verse 129 says God's laws are “wonderful,” which leads to obedience. What do you think makes God's Word feel wonderful rather than heavy – or what gets in the way of that sometimes?
5. Taken together, verses 129–131 move from wonder → light → longing. How do you see obedience, clarity in life, and holy desire connected in this progression, and what might break down when one of those pieces is missing?
6. The psalmist asks to be kept from being overcome by evil (verse 133). How might pride show up when we forget our need for God's guidance? What does humility look like instead?
7. How do you usually respond when you see people making choices that go against God's ways?
8. Why do you think disobedience in others moves the psalmist to grief (verse 136)? How might the psalmist's reaction invite you to reconsider your response?
9. Which verse in this passage is easiest for you to agree with? Which one is hardest to live out? What might that reveal about where God is inviting growth?

Closing Silence & Prayer: Invite the group to sit quietly for a moment with verse 133 (“Direct my steps by your word...”). Encourage participants to silently ask God: “Where are you inviting me to walk differently because I've heard You?”
