Live Your Calling

Big Idea

Playing it safe is holding you back.

1 Kings 19:19-21

Elijah and Elisha

Elijah's life is coming to an end so he is going to pass the baton of ministry on to the next Prophet, Elisha.

History/Context

This is a critical time in Israel's history. The people were ignoring God, living immorally, and worshiping false gods.

Elisha has a Decision: Accept or Decline?

Decline - stay in the family business - comfortable, safe, and predictable - keep plowing the field

Accept - take a risk - lose security and inheritance - follow God's call

What about me?

Many times we risk what we should protect and protect what we should risk.

One of the biggest marks of spiritual maturity is a short time span between God's command and our obedience.

You don't have to understand completely to obey immediately.

Sermon Applications

Reflect and/or Journal on Your Calling

Weight Comparison

Elisha's plow was familiar, heavy, and represented years of predictable labor. Elijah's cloak was also heavy—but with a different weight: the weight of calling, responsibility, and divine purpose. Both are heavy, but only one leads to destiny.

What feels heavy in your life right now? Is it the weight of unfulfilled calling or the weight of comfortable routine?

Mantle Math

You can't hold a plow (two hands required) and catch a mantle (two hands required) simultaneously. It's not addition - it's substitution. God doesn't want to add to your current life; He wants to exchange it.

What are you trying to "add Jesus to" instead of letting Him transform? We want Jesus + our career, Jesus + our lifestyle, Jesus + our comfort. But He's asking for subtraction before multiplication.

Assistant First

Elisha didn't become THE prophet immediately - he became AN assistant (v.21). Even after burning his plow, he entered a season of preparation. Burning the plow doesn't mean skipping the process.

Are you willing to follow your calling even if it starts with serving someone else's vision? Greatness often begins with faithfulness in someone else's field before God gives you your own.
