God's Fingerprints in the Dough

Big Idea

God's provision begins where our resources end.

2 Kings 4:42-44

A Faithful Gift

These had been brought to Elisha as firstfruits (verse 42). Normally these portions were reserved for God (Leviticus 23:20) and the Levitical priests (Numbers 18:13; Deuteronomy 18:4-5). They are brought to God's Prophet because the Northern kingdom has gone astray.

A Predictable Objection

Elisha commanded that a small amount of bread
be served to 100 men. Probably small loaves.
The servant immediately does the math.

An Overflowing Provision

Everyone ate. Everyone was satisfied.
There were leftovers.

This miracle is something like our Lord's feeding the
5,000 miraculously. Indeed, there are many things
in this chapter similar to facts in our Lord's history;
and this prophet might be more aptly considered a
type of our Lord, than most of the other persons
in the Scripture who have been thus honored.

Sermon Applications

Choose one of the following to put into practice this week.

1. The Generosity Experiment

Take a 30-day "first fruits experiment" challenge - give God the first of something (time, money, energy) each day and journal how God provides.

2. The Scarcity vs. Abundance Mindset Shift

When you catch yourself saying "I don't have enough..." stop and reframe it as "God, how do you want to use what I do have?"

3. The Leftover Blessing Practice

Intentionally create "leftovers" to bless others - cook extra food, budget extra money, schedule extra time - trusting God will still meet all your needs.

2 Kings 4:42-44

⁴² One day a man from Baal-shalishah brought the man of God a sack of fresh grain and twenty loaves of barley bread made from the first grain of his harvest. Elisha said, "Give it to the people so they can eat."

⁴³ "What?" his servant exclaimed. "Feed a hundred people with only this?"

But Elisha repeated, "Give it to the people so they can eat, for this is what the Lord says: Everyone will eat, and there will even be some left over!" ⁴⁴ And when they gave it to the people, there was plenty for all and some left over, just as the Lord had promised.
