Discussion Questions

Icebreaker: The Passover meal is full of symbols that tell a story. If you had to choose a food that represents your life right now, what would it be - and why?

1. Which element in the Seder meal spoke most to you, and how does it point to the work of Jesus?

2. Read Exodus 12:24–27. This passage talks about remembering what God did. Why do you think remembering important moments with God matters? What is one way you can more intentionally remember what God has done in your life?

3. Looking at Exodus 12:5–8, 46, what details about the Passover lamb stand out to you? How do these details connect to the idea of Christ as our Passover Lamb?

4. The Passover meal included bitter herbs to remind people of suffering (see Exodus 12:8). Why do you think God would want His people to remember painful things as well as good ones?

5. During Passover, people removed leaven (yeast) from their homes. Read 1 Corinthians 5:6–8. How is leaven used as a picture of sin? Is there any “leaven” (sin, attitude, or habit) in your life that God may be inviting you to surrender?

6. During the Last Supper (Luke 22:14–20) Jesus shares a cup before the meal and then after. Why do you think these moments are significant, and what might they reveal about God’s plan unfolding through the Passover?

7. How does understanding the Jewish roots of Passover deepen your appreciation for the Last Supper (Luke 22:7–20)?
