Jesus Is My Example

<u>Big Idea</u> I can endure all that I face in obedience to God, as I follow Jesus.

1 Peter 2:18-25
Unjust suffering because of faith in Christ is part of the Christian's calling.
The footsteps of Jesus lead through suffering and death, but they don't stop at the grave. They lead us on to eternal glory with God.

He was sinless but nevertheless suffered insults, wounds, and death. Jesus' redemptive death cannot be repeated or imitated, but his examp of entrusting himself to God rather than retaliatin is an example Peter wants his readers to follow when they suffer unjustly.	le ng
