Finding God in the Dry Places

Big Idea

Your greatest need becomes a gift when
it drives you to depend on God.

2 Kings 3:1-27

Back Story

- Moab has been paying a tax to Israel (100,000 lambs and the wool of 100,000 rams)
- New King/Evil King of Moab - stopped paying taxes (rebelled)
- Joram, King of Israel
- Jehoshaphat, King of Judah, King of Edom

Little Did They Know

2 Kings 3:9 - The king of Edom and his troops joined them, and all three armies traveled along a roundabout route through the wilderness for seven days. But there was no water for the men or their animals.

2 Kings 3:11a - But King Jehoshaphat of Judah asked, "Is there no prophet of the Lord with us? If there is, we can ask the Lord what to do through him."

-Worship changes our perspective.

-Worship invites God's power.

-Worship creates space to hear from God.

"Make this valley full of ditches: God promised to send water to the valley, but they had to dig the ditches to catch what God would provide. They had to dig the ditches before the water was apparent, so they could benefit from it when it came." -David Guzik

Sermon Applications

Choose one or two suggestions that resonate with you from this list to practice this week:

Worship First

- When facing a problem this week, pause and worship before trying to solve it.
- Play worship music during your commute or while doing household tasks.
- Journal about how worship changes your perspective on your current challenges.

Dig Your Ditch

Identify one practical step you can take in faith toward what you're asking God to do.

For example:

- If you need financial breakthrough, create a budget or start tithing.
- If you need healing in a relationship, make the first move to reconcile.
- If you need direction, start researching or taking small, exploratory steps.
- If you need spiritual refreshment, carve out time for daily Bible reading.

Depend on God

- Each morning this week, pray: "God, I can't do this without You. I'm depending on You today."
- Keep a "God Moments" journal noting how you see His provision and power.

Create Space to Hear

- Set aside 15 minutes of quiet time with God daily. Turn off distractions and ask God what He wants to say to you.
