Why Tell Someone?

Big Idea

Evangelism isn't optional - it's Jesus's
command and our calling.

Matthew 28:18-20, Romans 10:14-15

Jesus has the (all) authority.

Jesus says to go and make - so
we should go and make.

Jesus is with us on the mission.

Someone has to tell them.
Tell Someone.

Paul rightly observes that it all goes back to the
preaching and sharing of the gospel.

Sermon Questions

Icebreaker (pick one):

- If you could invite any famous person (living or from history) to church, who would it be and why?
- Who first shared the good news of Jesus with you, and what do you remember most about that experience?

1. What is one thing that stood out to you from this week's message?
2. On a scale of 0-10, how often do you think about the spiritual condition of the people you know? (0 = never / 10 = constantly)
3. On a scale of 0-10, how urgent is it for people to hear and respond to the gospel? (0 = not urgent at all / 10 = extremely urgent).
4. How do you feel about unbelievers?
5. If you've shared the gospel or been blessed to lead someone to Jesus, in what ways did it energize your own faith and enthusiasm?
6. According to Mathew 28:18-20, what did Jesus command His followers to do?
7. What's the first word, thought, or feeling that pops into your mind when hearing the words "authority" and "command"?
8. Does the fact that Jesus has "all authority" and "commanded" His followers to do these things fit with your picture of Jesus? Why or why not?
9. Why do you think Paul emphasizes a step-by-step order in Romans 10:14-15, and what does it show us about how God chooses to work through people? (believe – hear – tell – sent)
10. What do you think Paul means in Romans 10:15 calling the messengers' feet "beautiful," and how does that image shape the way we view sharing the gospel?
