<u>Big Idea</u>

Do you need some good news today?

Talk It Over

<u>Ice Breaker</u>: What from your grandparents did you or would you enjoy inheriting?

- 1. What items in 1 Peter 1:3-5 would you list as "already available" to the Christian? What would you list under "not yet, but glad it's coming?" How do the ones on the "not yet" list support the "already" list?
- 2. What are the unique characteristics mentioned about this inheritance? How does that compare with an inheritance left behind by an extremely wealthy person for his child?
- 3. How does/should/could understanding our inheritance affect our priorities in this life?
- 4. What could you do that would help you to consciously place your hope in your future inheritance, rather than on the present?
- 5. Read Matthew 6:19-21 how would you define a treasure? Why are treasures so appealing to us? Does Jesus condemn our desire for treasure?
- 6. Jesus refers to two types of treasures temporary & eternal. What are some of the characteristics of each type of treasure? What is the benefit to pursuing eternal treasure? (Matthew 6:19-21, 2 Corinthians 4:16–18, Psalms 49:16-17)
- 7. How does your choice of treasure affect your attitude toward life?

<u>Dig Deeper</u>: Find a moment in a quiet spot and ask God to help you to identify where your treasure really is. Read 2 Cor. 4:16–18, Proverbs 23:4–5, Matthew 6:19-24, Luke 12:32-34.
