Planted in the Word

Big Idea

Spiritual growth isn't accidental - it's rooted in Scripture that shapes our desires, decision, and direction.

Psalm 119:9-16

Key Verse for the Week:
I have hidden your word in my heart, that I might not sin against you. -Psalm 119:11

God's Word cleanses, guides, and guards our lives.
Verses 9-11

Scripture isn't just information - it's formation!

The psalmist understood the importance of not only silently reading or hearing the Word of God, but also the importance in saying it.

The Word must move from: page → heart → practice.
Verses 15-16

We can almost hear a challenge from the psalmist: "You live your compromising, impure life that thinks it knows pleasure and satisfaction; I will cleanse my way and give the fullness of my life to God and His word, and we will see who will be more blessed, more happy, and more filled with life." -David Guzik

Listening Question of the Week:
God, what are You shaping in me through
Your Word right now?

Sermon Questions

Icebreaker: Psalm 119 compares God's Word to great treasure. What's something small you own that you would be surprisingly upset to lose?

1. What is one thing that stood out to you from this week's message?
2. Verse 9 asks a question: "How can a young person stay on the path of purity?" Why do you think the writer frames this as a question rather than a statement?
 - What do these action words suggest about the kind of relationship the psalmist has with God and God's Word?
 - How might God be inviting you to be more intentional?
3. As you read Psalm 119: 9–16, circle or list the action words (such as find, hidden, praise, delight).
 - What do these action words suggest about the kind of relationship the psalmist has with God and God's Word?
 - How might God be inviting you to be more intentional?
4. Verse 11 says "I have hidden your word in my heart." What does it look like in everyday life to "hide" God's Word in your heart?
5. What can you do to help Scripture move from information in our minds to formation in our hearts?
6. In verse 14 the psalmist values God's Word more than "riches." What competes most with Scripture for your attention and allegiance?
7. Verse 15 emphasizes meditation and careful attention. What do you think biblical meditation involves, and how might it differ from simply reading Scripture quickly?
8. In verses 14 and 16, the psalmist delights in God's laws. How does this compare to your attitude toward Scripture?
9. Verse 16 emphasizes not forgetting (neglecting) God's Word. What small, maintainable step could help you stay planted in Scripture over the long haul?
