God, Bless This Mess

Big Idea

God can deal with our baggage.

Genesis 25:19-34

Isaac and Rebekah

Like Sarah before her (11:30) and Rachel after her (29:31), Rebekah is unable to have children.

Isaac prays to the Lord.

When in need – Pray!

God can answer prayers.

Parental favoritism isn't good. Favoritism became an ingredient for conflict and heartache.

Esau is really hungry / 25:29-34

Everyone has been wired by God.

Don't let your physical needs control you.

God can pull off "the end justifies the means", but we can't – especially when the means are filled with deception.

Study Questions

1. What stood out to you, challenged you, or encouraged you from Sunday's sermon/service?
2. Why did Isaac pray to the Lord in v. 21? Why did Rebekah pray? Both Isaac and Rebekah prayed. What do the following Scriptures say about prayer? Deuteronomy 4:7; Proverbs 15:8; Matthew 7:7-11. Put these verses into your own words.
3. In what area of life would you and/or your family do well to follow Isaac and Rebekah's example of praying and active waiting on the LORD? How will you do that?
4. In Genesis 25:27-28, we have a description of the differences between Esau and Jacob, and a brief description of the relations in the family as they grow up. What indicates there will be trouble? What is your reaction to this description? Why?
5. Hebrews 12:16 says that Esau was immoral and irreverent or unholy because he sold his birthright for a single meal. Too often today, like Esau, we give into our sinful desires for instant gratification that cause us to sacrifice our eternal rewards. What are some examples of this from our culture and personal lives?
6. According to 1 Peter 1:3-5 what is our inheritance as believers? In what ways do we "sell out" our inheritance? In what ways can we embrace our inheritance?
