Big Idea

When I am in the wrong place, God is there.

1 Kings 19:1-18

Back Story

The Battle at Mount Carmel

1 Kings 18:39 - And when all the people saw it, they fell face down on the ground and cried out, “The Lord-He is God! Yes, the Lord is God!”

The Broom Tree Prayer

Elijah prayed that he might die.

1 Kings 19:4b – “I have had enough, Lord,” he said. “Take my life, for I am no better than my ancestors who have already died.”

“What are you doing here, Elijah?”

Gentle Whisper

Sermon Questions

1. Which part of the message was most impactful for you and why?
2. What do you think of Elijah's request of the Lord "take my life"? Have you ever told the Lord "I have had enough"? Can you tell us about it?
3. What story is Elijah telling himself over and over (see 1 Kings 19:10,14)? Is it true?
4. How does God help Elijah confront the story he is telling himself?
5. Compare Elijah's state of mind before and after his encounter with God at Mount Sinai. What changed?
6. Just like Elijah, God wants to replace the lies we believe about ourselves or our circumstances with His truth. How has God replaced lies with truth in your life? Share an example.
7. How does this chapter highlight the significance of listening in our relationship with God?
8. How can Elijah's journey to Mount Sinai be metaphorically applied to your spiritual journey?
