Suffering, But Not In Vain

Big Idea

The suffering of Jesus, is Jesus on Mission

Isaiah 53:7-9

If appears on the surface that the Servant
has suffered in vain.

No one seemed to recognize what Jesus
was actually doing.

Lamb to slaughter:

This is the picture of the Lamb in Revelation, "looking as if it had been slain" (Revelation 5:6)

He did not open his mouth:

Jesus did not respond to the charges of the Sanhedrin (Mark 14:60-61) nor to the questions of Pilate (Mark 15:4-5) and Herod (Luke 23:8-9).

Acts 8:26-40

As they rode along, they came to some water, and the eunuch said, "Look! There's some water!

Why can't I be baptized?" He ordered the carriage to stop, and they went down into the water, and Philip baptized him. -Acts 8:36-38

Study Questions

1. What stood out to you, challenged you, or encouraged you from Sunday's sermon/service?
2. What do you think today's Isaiah text says about a Christian's speaking? About remaining silent? In what circumstances? (Proverbs 10:13-14, 20-21)
3. What effect did these verses have on Philip? How might we use these verses powerfully in someone else's life?
4. Read 1 Peter 2:21-25. How do these verses connect to the Isaiah passage?
5. What does Christ's suffering mean for us today? What does it mean for our future?
