When Life Demands Too Much

Big Idea

God knows how to do a lot with a little.

2 Kings 4:1-7

2 Kings 4:1 - One day the widow of a member of the group of prophets came to Elisha and cried out, "My husband who served you is dead, and you know how he feared the Lord. But now a creditor has come, threatening to take my two sons as slaves."

Not enough is where God starts:
husband died, widow, single mom.
He was a follower of God...

How does Elisha respond???

2 Kings 4:2 - "What can I do to help you?" Elisha asked.

"Tell me, what do you have in the house?"

"Nothing at all, except a flask of olive oil," she replied.

What do you have?

Nothing!

She focused on what she didn't have - just like we do.

She didn't have a husband/savings/job/any hope.

2 Kings 4:3 - And Elisha said, "Borrow as many empty jars as you can from your friends and neighbors.

She had to ask for help - she needs empty jars.

She had to deal with any pride she had.

Why? Pride doesn't ask for jars.

Sometimes miracles start when we admit our need.

Sermon Applications

1. The Gratitude Inventory

- Make a list of "what you have" instead of focusing on what you lack
- Write down at least 10 things (resources, relationships, abilities, faith, etc.)
- Thank God specifically for each one

2. The Fear Audit

- Write down a current fear or worry
- Identify: Is this fear exaggerating the truth or outright lying?
- Replace the lie with truth from Scripture
