Sermon Notes

Open My Eyes

Big Idea

Fear shrinks when faith sees
God's unseen presence.

2 Kings 6:8-17

The Problem:

We often see the enemy before
we see God. (2 Kings 6:8-15)

The king of Aram thought he had a military problem.
He assumed there was a spy.
Instead, God was revealing his plans to Elisha.

New Perspective:

It's not how we look - it's how we see.

Fear looks at the circumstances.
Faith looks beyond them. (2 Kings 6:16)

The Miracle:

The greatest miracle wasn't the Army of God (the Army was already there). It was opening the eyes of the servant. (2 Kings 6:17)

Elisha doesn't pray, "Lord, destroy the army."
He doesn't pray, "Lord, rescue us."
He prays, "Lord, open his eyes."

Sermon Applications

Choose one or more of the following to practice this week:

Daily Prayer Practice

Each morning this week, before you look at your problems, pray Elisha's prayer: "Lord, open my eyes to see where You are already at work today."

Scripture Meditation

Memorize 2 Kings 6:16 - "Don't be afraid! For there are more on our side than on theirs!" Recite it when fear begins to rise.

Crisis Journal

Keep a "God Showed Up" journal. When facing a specific pressure (family, finances, health, church, the future, our nation, etc.) write down the fear. Then later, document how God provided—in small practical ways. Review it when new fears arise.

TIP: You can begin the journal by remembering back and journaling a couple of crises in the recent past and record how God provided.
