## Listening for God's Direction

### Big Idea

God guides us step by step through  
His Word as we listen and obey.

Psalm 119:105-112

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Key Verse for the Week:  
Your word is a lamp to guide my feet and  
a light for my path. -Psalm 119:105

God often gives direction, not details.

Worthy  
Following  
In the Light

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God's guidance is progressive.  
He leads us in a way that forces dependence,  
not independence.

Listening requires trust.

Trust listens even when life hurts.

Listening becomes hardest when life becomes  
heaviest - but that's also when listening matters most.

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Obedience sharpens spiritual hearing.

Obedience builds determination and discernment.

Obedience strengthens spiritual focus the same  
way training strengthens muscles.

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## Sermon Questions

Icebreaker: When you're trying to get somewhere new, are you more likely to follow GPS step-by-step or study the whole map first? How does that relate to how God guides us through His Word?

1. What part of the sermon stood out to you most – something encouraging, challenging, or new? Why do you think that resonated with you?
2. The sermon emphasized that God guides us step by step, not all at once. When have you experienced God giving just enough direction for the next step?
3. In Psalm 119:105 the psalmist uses the images of lamp and light. Pastor Kendall noted that a lamp in biblical times only illuminated the next step or two. Why do you think God often gives direction without full details?
4. Where are you currently wishing God would show you the whole path instead of just the next step? What might it look like to trust His Word for today's step?
5. According to verses 107–110, what kinds of circumstances is the psalmist facing?
6. In the middle of pain, the psalmist asks God to “teach” him instead of simply removing the struggle. What does this reveal to us about the connection between trust, obedience, and pain?
7. The psalmist remains obedient when life is hard, confusing, or unfair. What makes obedience hardest for you – in ease or in hardship – and why?
8. The psalmist says God's Word is his “treasure” (verse 111). How does viewing Scripture as a treasure change the way we approach reading and obeying it?
9. This week's listening question is: “Lord, what is my next faithful step?” What would it look like to let Scripture be the first voice you listen to before your feelings, fears, or frustrations?
