Sermon Notes

March 15, 2026

The Door of Deliverance

Big Idea

Just as Israel was saved by the lamb's blood on their doors, we are saved by the blood of Jesus, our Passover Lamb.

Exodus 12:21-23

Exodus 12 tells the story of the final plague that God brings upon Egypt, which leads to the liberation of the Israelites from slavery.

The Sacrifice of the Lamb

This lamb is a foreshadowing of Jesus Christ, the ultimate Passover Lamb, who is without sin.

The Angel of Death

The passage indicates that the Lord Himself will pass through Egypt that night to strike down every firstborn. However, where He sees the blood on the doorposts, He will not allow the destroyer to enter.

Divine Protection

The Israelites are called to trust in God's provision through the sacrifice, symbolizing faith in His deliverance.

Jesus Christ's death was not just an event in history but the fulfilment of God's redemptive plan for all of us. Through the blood of Jesus, believers are granted access to God and assured forgiveness - an eternal promise secured by His sacrificial love.

Sermon Questions

Icebreaker: Have you ever accidentally walked through the wrong door – like the wrong classroom, meeting room, or restroom? What happened?

1. What part of the sermon stood out to you most – something encouraging, challenging, or new? Why do you think that resonated with you?
2. Read Exodus 12. What stands out to you most about the specific instructions God gave Israel about the lamb and the blood on the doorposts? What does this level of detail reveal about God's character?
3. Imagine being an Israelite that night in Egypt. What would it take to trust that putting blood on your door would bring deliverance?
4. In Exodus 12, the homes that were protected were the ones marked by the lamb's blood. What do you think it means today for a person's life to be "marked" by the saving work of Jesus?
5. In 1 Peter 1:18–20, Peter says we were not saved with money or things that fade away, but with the precious blood of Christ. What does that tell us about our salvation?
6. Hebrews 9:20–22 says that without the shedding of blood there is no forgiveness of sins. Why do you think sacrifice is such an important part of God's plan to deal with sin? How does this shape the way we approach God?
7. On that night in Egypt, some homes experienced judgment while others experienced rescue. What does that show us about both God's justice and His mercy?
8. In 1 Peter 1:18–20 we see that Christ was chosen long ago to redeem us. What does it mean to you personally that God made a way of deliverance long before we ever needed it?
