The Door of Surrender

Big Idea

Following Jesus means surrendering to Him not just as Savior, but as King.

Matthew 21:8-10

Zechariah 9:9

Rejoice, O people of Zion!
Shout in triumph, O people of Jerusalem!
Look, your king is coming to you.
He is righteous and victorious,
yet he is humble, riding on a donkey -
riding on a donkey's colt.

Psalm 118:22-26

The stone that the builders rejected
has now become the cornerstone.

Sermon Questions

Icebreaker: What's the most unusual or unexpected thing you've ever been asked to do - and did you do it?

1. What is one thing that stood out to you from this week's message?
2. Read Matthew 21: 1-3,6,7. What do you notice about the disciples' obedience in this passage? How do John 14:15 and 1 Samuel 15:22 help you understand *why* the disciples obeyed Jesus like they did?
3. What does that kind of obedience look like in your own life and how might Proverbs 3:5-6 and Hebrews 11:8 encourage you?
4. The disciples' obedience helped set up this moment. How can your obedience to Jesus help others see Him more clearly? (Matthew 5:16; 1 Peter 2:12)
5. Jesus intentionally enters Jerusalem in a way that fulfills prophecy (see Zechariah 9:9) and shows He is the true King. What does that tell us about the character of God? How does it shape the way we respond to him today?
6. The crowd calls Jesus "Son of David" (Matthew 21:9). This means they saw Him as a promised King. Why is it important to see Jesus as King, not just Savior?
7. The crowd was excited and loud in praising Jesus. Why do you think people can be excited about Jesus but not truly follow Him? How can we cultivate a deeper, lasting devotion? (Luke 6:46-49)
8. People laid their cloaks before Jesus (Matthew 21:8), a sign of honor and surrender. What modern-day "cloak" do you need to lay down before Jesus (a habit, fear, control, or plan)? What would it look like, in a practical way, for you to surrender?
