The Interpretation:

## A Summary to Consider:

In the Tribulation, the Antichrist comes over from Rome to Jerusalem. As he is touring and making speeches about “peace in our time” and the “peace process” with the “religion of peace” someone will assassinate him. He will be laid in state for 3 days and three nights. Then the spirit of Judas Iscariot (John 17:12) comes up from “his own place” (Acts 1:25) in the pit (Rev 9:11) and enters the dead body of that Man of Sin, while the soul of the Devil comes down from the 3<sup>rd</sup> heaven (Rev 12:9) and brings that dead body back to life (Rev 13:2-3); and out of that casket comes the Son of Perdition (2Thes 2:3), Satan incarnate (2Thes 2:7-8). He comes up with a bad right eye and bad arm (Zech 11:17)

As a perfect imitation (modern versions take on 1Cor 11:1) of the resurrected Christ, the Son of Perdition enters the rebuilt Jewish temple and goes to the Holy of Holies where he sits down on the mercy seat of the Ark of the Covenant. He puts one hand on one cherub and his other hand on the other cherub and says to the TV cameras and to the Jewish priests standing there horror-stricken, “I am God (2Thes 2:4); the worship service will now begin!”

And it begins. His “ministers” (2Cor 11:15) go out to the brazen altar there in the courtyard and stop the sacrifice of those two lambs every day. In their place, the Antichrist starts his own sacrifices: Jews beheaded at the altar (Rev 6:9, 20:4). Their flesh is eaten (Isa 6:13) and their blood is drunk (Psa 16:4) in a “Mass” to “the god of this world” (2Cor 4:4, 1Cor 10:20, Dan 11:38). To top everything off, the False Prophet has an image of the Antichrist set up, and whoever won’t worship it will be killed (Rev 13:11-15): so it’s Daniel 3 all over again. That is what is involved “concerning the daily sacrifice and the transgression of desolation.” Dan 8:13
