1. Prophecy is history recorded in advance.

Daniel 2:45 Matthew 16:1-3

2. Prophecy is supernatural – a divine attribute of God alone.

Isaiah 46:9-10 Revelation 19:10

3. Fulfillment must be clear and precise in every detail.

Deuteronomy 18:20-22

- 4. Virtually all prophecy carries multiple fulfillments.
- 5. The main subject of prophecy is the millennial kingdom of Jesus Christ.
- 6. All prophecy regarding political nations is in relation to the nation of Israel.
- 7. Prophetic interpretation belongs to God alone.
