- We need examples in life. In almost every area of life we need to see something modeled to truly understand it. Relationships are no different. If your desire is to "tweasure your wuv" for life it helps if you can see that modeled. Probably the best example we have in this area is Jesus. Don't freak out, I'm not suggesting Jesus was married. Jesus modeled to us how to love our spouses well when He modeled Humility and Submission.
- According to Philippians 2:6-8, Jesus was equal to God. This equality is important because of how he
  acted. He did not use this equality for his own advantage but rather took on the nature of a servant.
  Servants serve. He humbled himself and became obedient to what was needed for our sake (dying on the
  cross for our benefit).
- When you read the Bible, you begin to see some God-given authority structures form in the area of mutual submission.
  - 1) God submits to Jesus (John 5:22-23)
  - 2) Jesus submits to God (John 8:28)
  - 3) The Holy Spirit submits to God and Jesus (John 16:13)
  - 4) Men submit to the headship of Christ (1 Corinthians 11:3)



- 5) Wives submit to their husbands (1 Peter 3:1)
- 6) Husbands submit their actions to love for their wives (Ephesians 5:25)
- 7) Children submit to their parents (Colossians 3:20)
- 8) Everyone submits to God (Proverbs 23:22; Acts 5:29)
- 9) Employees submit to their employers (Colossians 3:22-23)
- 10) Everyone submits to the governing authorities (1 Peter 2:13)
- 11) Everyone submits to one another (Ephesians 5:21)

## DISCUSSION

- Did you grow up in a competitive family?
- How is the desire to 'win' displayed in your marriage, relationship, and/or friendships?
- What is the difference between Obedience and Submission?
  - Submission includes a voluntary yielding and Obedience is more of a compliance.
  - Submission is an *inner attitude* and Obedience is an *outer act*.
  - Have someone read **1 Samuel 16:7** in light of the above definition and discuss.
  - Are both necessary?
- Giving up the need to 'win' in your marriage, relationship, and/or friendships obviously involves submission. However, is there ever a time when it's acceptable for you to not submit?
  - Short answer: Submission stops at the threshold of violating God's moral principals.
- Who is better at 'Giving Up the Win' in your marriage or relationships (you or the other)?
- Why is it difficult for you to 'Give Up the Win'? OR Why is it natural for you to 'Give Up the Win'?
- Have someone read (Ephesians 5:31-33)
  - If married, what are some ways your spouse does well at living out this passage?
  - If not married, what are some things you can begin doing to improve in this area?
