Psalm 27

Waiting on God in prayer is not just a suggestion or possibility in our lives. Throughout Scripture, waiting on God is commanded, commended, and celebrated. Waiting serves as an opportunity for us to reaffirm trust in God, to rest in Him, and live by faith. But for many of us, we don't see waiting that way.

When you have to wait, do it FAST.

Focus— turn your focus from the uncertainty or lack of control back to God. What we want to ask is, “What’s going on?” or “Why is it taking so long?” Instead, “What might God be doing here?” or “What opportunity is God presenting to me?”

Adore— Once your focus shifts from what you don’t know to a focus on God, you can be intentional about your worship and admiration of Him.

Seek— Waiting becomes an active exercise when you seek God. Seeking is embracing the fact that you’re not in control, but knowing you can talk to the One who is. When you don’t know what’s going on, seek the One who does.

Trust— Faithful waiting involves a faith-filled, bold trust in God even when the answers aren’t clear.

FAST— That’s how you wait on the Lord. It’s how you live on what’s true about the God that lives in you when you don’t know what’s true about the life that’s around you.

Pray: *“God, help me not to miss the opportunities you have placed around me. Help me to see You, even in the midst of the waiting and the silence. Help me to actively seek You during the process, and to trust Your character and timing.”*
