Session 2: Can we Trust the Bible?

- 1. Have you ever wondered if you could trust the Bible as God's Word?
- **2.** Have you ever heard anyone doubt the reliability of the New Testament? If so, what did they say? What did you think about it?
- **3.** What was the most interesting fact you learned from the section about what the Bible says about the Bible?
- **4.** For further study read 1 Tim. 5:18 and 2 Peter 3:16. Any guesses at why these are significant as we look at the trustworthiness of the Bible?
 - a. Leader Note: 1 Tim. 5 quotes Deut. 24:5 and Luke 10:7. What this shows us is that 1 the Gospel of Luke was written before the death of Paul and 2- that Pual equated Luke's Gospel with the authority given to Old Testament Scripture. 2 Peter 3:16 shows that Peter lumped Paul's writings into the category of Scripture.
 - i. So at the VERY least, Paul and Luke are considered as Holy Scripture by the Bible. And even if that is the only parts we decide to trust, that is over 50% of the New Testament! Luke wrote his Gospel and Acts. Paul wrote Romans, 1&2 Corinthians, 1 & 2 Thessalonians, Galatians, Ephesians, Colossians, 1&Timothy, Titus, Philemon and maybe Hebrews.
- **5.** What was the most interesting fact that you learned about the reliability of the New Testament?
