

Summary:

This Palm Sunday message explores Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem and His deep desire for people to understand 'the way to peace.' Pastor emphasizes that Jesus wept over Jerusalem because the people missed the peace He came to bring, even though He was heading to the cross to die for them. The sermon reveals that true peace cannot be found in worldly things like money, promotions, or possessions, but only through Jesus Christ who offers a peace that the world cannot give.

Intro Prayer:

Heavenly Father, as we gather together today, we ask that You open our hearts and minds to receive what You want to teach us. Help us to be receptive to Your Spirit and to understand the way to peace that Jesus demonstrated on Palm Sunday. Remove any distractions or preconceived notions that might prevent us from hearing Your voice clearly. We surrender our own agendas and ask that You would speak to each person here according to their specific needs. In Jesus' name, Amen.

Ice Breaker:

What's one thing that usually brings you a sense of calm or peace when life gets stressful?

Key Verses:

John 14:27

Luke 19:28-44

Zechariah 9:9

Romans 5:1

Questions:

- Jesus had a wish that people would 'understand the way to peace.' What do you think prevents people today from finding true peace?
- The disciples had peace even while 'borrowing' someone's donkey because they trusted Jesus' word. How does trusting God's promises bring peace to difficult situations in your life?
- Jesus wept over Jerusalem because the people missed recognizing when God visited them. How can we make sure we don't miss God's presence in our daily lives?
- The pastor mentioned that prophecies fulfilled give us peace because God's word is reliable. Which biblical promise gives you the most comfort during uncertain times?
- Looking back at your life, what are some specific ways God has shown His power and faithfulness to you? How does remembering these moments affect your current peace level?
- There's a difference between being 'around' the church versus being 'in' the church. What are some practical ways someone can move from just attending to being truly engaged in God's presence?
- Jesus was heading to the cross but was still concerned about our peace. How does understanding the depth of Christ's love for you personally impact your ability to trust Him with your worries?

Life Application:

This week, spend time each day remembering and writing down specific ways God has shown His faithfulness in your life. When anxiety or worry tries to steal your peace, refer back to this list and declare God's promises over your situation. Also, take one practical step to move from being 'around' God's presence to being 'in' His presence – whether that's through deeper Bible study, joining a small group, or serving in ministry.

Key Takeaways:

- True peace can only be found in Jesus Christ, not in worldly possessions or achievements.
- God's prophecies and fulfilled promises provide a solid foundation for peace in uncertain times
- Remembering God's past faithfulness and power helps us trust Him in current situations
- God's peace is available to everyone, including those who feel they've wandered too far from Him
- There's a difference between being around God's presence and being truly engaged with Him

As we remember Your journey to the cross, help us never to forget that You did it all so we could have peace with God.
