- +The two main kinds of God's grace are "common" and "saving."
- **+Common Grace** is God's gift to all humanity.

God gives common grace to everyone not because we deserve it, but because He is faithful and generous.

+ Just living and breathing is not truly living at all, until you accept God's saving grace.

- +Saving Grace: The promise to those who believe in Jesus.
- +Saving grace results in our sanctification. It serves as our justification to make a way for our glorification in Christ.
