A Message From Pastor Dave

God is calling us to something greater than we are, and I am excited about the possibilities. I pray you are as well.

Now more than ever we need to be Christ's Church. Six months into this pandemic, 22% of church going Christians stopped attending worship services, digital or physical, and in 2020 that number increased to 25%.

Seek the peace and prosperity of the city to which I have carried you into exile. Pray to The Lord for it, because if it prospers, you too will prosper - Jeremiah 29:7 (NIV)

Sunday April 3rd will be our "Good Neighbor(hood) Weekend" We will not be holding worship services this weekend. Why?

Instead of *hearing* a message on loving our neighborhood, we will be *living* a message on loving our neighborhood

This is our "Do Something" Plan, and:

1) We have been <u>PREPARED</u> to Do Something great We are God's workmanship, created in Christ Jesus to do good works, which <u>God prepared</u> in advance for us to do - Ephesians 2:10

2) There is a <u>PURPOSE</u> whenever we Do Something Loving God means doing what He tells us to do, and really, that isn't hard at all - 1 John 5:3 (TLB)

3) God has provided us with the <u>POWER</u> to Do Something With God's power working in us, God can do much, much more than anything we can ask or imagine - Ephesians 3:20 (NCV)

4) Doing Something significant requires <u>Passion</u> to keep moving forward Anyone who puts a hand to the plow and <u>then looks back</u> is not fit for service in the Kingdom of God - Luke 9:62

OUR FIRST STEPS IN LOVING OUR NEIGHBORHOOD

- 1) INVITE A NEIGHBOR TO WORSHIP AND A MEAL
- 2) GIVE A THANKSGIVING OFFERING FOR OUR MINISTRIES

3) PREPARE FOR GOOD NEIGHBOR WEEKEND April 3rd, 2022 Whenever we have the opportunity to help anyone, we should do it - Galatians 6:10

WAYS TO PREPARE FOR GOOD NEIGHBOR(HOOD) WEEKEND

- Ask my neighbors how I might help them that weekend
- Decide with my small group which project(s) we will do
- If I don't know my neighbors, invite them to a time of conversation
- Rach out to my community leaders and ask "what needs done?"

Discovering Our Neighborhood

"Seek the peace and prosperity of the city to which I have carried you into exile. Pray to the Lord for it, because if it prospers, you too will prosper - Jeremiah 29:7 (NIV)

For the second time in its history, Israel was in captivity in a place they had not chosen. What God told them to do - seek the peace and prosperity of the city that had taken them captive – seemed impossible.

How much more does God want us to do this same thing for the communities we have chosen to live in?

As Christ's Church, we are to make the cities where we live better. In this discussion, we will discuss a few biblical strategies for taking the love of God outside the church walls and into the neighborhoods around us.

OPEN YOUR GROUP WITH A PRAYER. THIS IS ONLY A GUIDE - SELECT THE POINTS YOU WANT TO DISCUSS.

THE DO SOMETHING PLAN

Jesus said, "Most assuredly I say to you, he who believes in Me, the works that I do he will do also; and greater works than these he will do, because I go to My Father" - John 14:12 (NKJV)

1. <u>COUNT: all the people in pain in your neighborhood.</u>

- What does God say? Read Luke 17:11-14. How does this verse demonstrate that Christ notices those in pain?
- What does it mean?
 - When you look at your neighborhood or community, do you know how many people are in pain?
 - How many are divorced? How many have experienced violent interactions? How many...?
 - Of what value is it to know this? How will this knowledge motivate you to act?

2. WALK: Notice all those around you in need of help.

- What does God say? What will happen to every place you walk, according to Deuteronomy 11:22-25?
- What does it mean?
 - Does God promise us territory for our own benefit? For what purpose are we to claim territory?
 - How would it look if our church was known more for community outreach?

3. ASK: What do you need?

- What does God say? Mark 10:46-52 tells what happened when Jesus walked by a blind man named Bartimaeus.
 - Look at verse 47. What did the blind man cry out?
 - What did Jesus say in response? (verse 51).
 - What happened as a result? (verse 52.)
- What does it mean?
 - If you said to a friend who was hurting--"What can I do for you?"-- how do you think they would feel?
 - How would you feel? Discuss as a group how to approach someone you know is hurting.





4. LOVE: Respond in a way that honors God by obeying him and loving others.

- What does God say? According to 1 John 5:3, how do we show the love of God?
- What does it mean?
 - Jesus said that after loving God, the second most important thing in life is to love your neighbor as yourself.. How does knowing that God says it is important to love others change your attitude about people you may not like? Is there anything you can change to allow the love of God to flow through you?
 - Many of us have experienced God's comfort and help when we have gone through a difficult time. How can
 we turn our negative experience into something positive by helping someone else? Who can you help? Share
 any personal experiences.

Diving Deeper (optional)

And now the cry of the Israelites has reached me, and I have seen the way the Egyptians are oppressing them. So now, go. I am sending you to Pharaoh to bring my people the Israelites out of Egypt - Exodus 3:9-10 (NIV)

Scripture tells us that when people cry out, God sends a deliverer in response. He has created the church as a body of resources to minister to the needs of the community. What next step is he asking you to take?

Ask God to help you:

- Count all the people around you in pain.
- Walk around and notice how many are hurting.
- Ask "How can I help?"
- Love by obeying God.

Take a few moments to reflect on these two questions:

- 1. Who could I help?
- 2. What can I do to help my neighborhood?

Share your thoughts in the group.
