



A Message From Pastor Dave How do we serve God? We serve God, by serving other people. Whenever we use our talents, our time, our energy, our resources, our gifts to help other people, we are serving them, and, we are ministering to them. In doing so, we are serving God. Every one of us is a minister. Every time you help somebody you are ministering to that person. But God says; I don't want you to do this by yourself. I don't want you to minister alone. I want you to do it in community.

Philippians 2:2 tells us to agree with each other, love one another, and work together with one heart and one purpose. How do we work together with one heart and one purpose? And why does God call us to serve with other people?

One reason is because we are family. 1 Corinthians 3:9 tells us to work together as partners who belong to God. God says to us, I want you to work together as partners. We are a family when we are working together.

Another reason God calls us to serve together is because we need each other. Nobody has all the talents. Nobody has all the gifts. Nobody has all the resources. Nobody has all the time. Nobody has all the energy. You need me, I need you, and we all need each other. Nobody can do it all by themselves. 1 Corinthians 12:27 tells us that we are all a part of the body of Christ, and each part of the body needs all the others. We have to be connected in order to do what God calls us to do.

A third reason God calls us to serve together is because we get more done together. Ecclesiastes 4:9 tells us that two are better off than one because together they can work more effectively. Teamwork multiplies effectiveness. You might be thinking; 'what can I do? I don't have any talents. I don't have any gifts. I'm too young. I'm too old. What do I have to offer?' You have something. We all have something. But on our own, we don't have everything. That's why we need each other.

Maybe you have fond memories of being on a team; playing a sport, singing in a choir, playing in a band. Maybe you were, or are, part of a bowling team, a golf league, a craft guild, or another team. Being on a team brings us closer together. We get more done, and, we have more fun!

What does it take to build up a team? First, we need trust. Trust is the emotional glue that draws us closer to our friends, our family, our neighbors, our church family, our co-workers everyone. Without trust it is difficult to have the kinds of intimate relationships that God wants us to have. Trust is the glue that holds a team together. In 1 Timothy 6:20 Paul wrote to Timothy; guard what has been entrusted to your care. Serving together involves trust. In order to build trust we have to share responsibility.

Second we need empathy. 1 Peter 3:8 says; live in harmony with one another and be sympathetic. We can't have harmony without empathy. We can't have a team without being aware of what's going on in each other's lives. More than just serving together, we also have to be aware of each other.

Here's the question we all need to ask; how are we as Christ's Church going to make a difference in our communities? Hebrews 10:25 gives us the answer: *let us not give up the habit of meeting together, but let us encourage one another.* Don't stop doing what you're doing. Keep on serving. Keep on meeting together. Get connected with a LIFEGroup. Keep learning how to grow together. Fellowship together, reach out together, and to serve together. Why? Because we need each other.

If you look around at all the challenges and problems in our communities, it can soon feel pretty discouraging. It can feel pretty depressing. Poverty and illiteracy and disease and addiction and human trafficking and all the other problems we are facing can overwhelm us. And we soon think; how in the world can I make difference? Many times we look at the problems of the world and we are tempted to ask God; 'why don't You do something about it?' But friends, God is asking us the same question; 'why don't you do something about it?' There is enormous, incredible power in a team. We take more risks when we are together than when we are on our own. When you have a committed team, a compelling purpose, and a clear vision, God says, you will be unstoppable.

Agree with each other, love one another, and work together with one heart, and one purpose (Philippians 2:2). Friends, Good Neighbor Weekend is coming up quickly. Let us continue to seek ways to work together with one heart and one strong purpose in love. Let us continue to reach out together, grow together, and serve together. Let us continue to build up trust and show empathy with one another, and let us continue to journey together on one mission with one clear vision. Why? Because we are better together. And we are better together, when we serve together.

Be in prayer as you prepare for Good Neighbor Weekend. God is going to do a mighty thing through you, through us, through His Church.

This is the UMCOR International Disaster Response and Recovery Fund.


This fund will provide direct assistance to those in Ukraine as well as assistance to Ukrainians fleeing to neighboring countries.

March 13th, 2022
Dear Church:
"What Jesus Writes
To A Confused Church"
(Message 3 of 7)

To the angel of the church in Pergamum write: These are the words of him who has the sharp, double-edged sword. I know where you live - where satan has his throne. Yet you remain true to my name. You did not renounce your faith in me, not even in the days of Antipas, my faithful witness, who was put to death in your city - where satan lives. Nevertheless, I have a few things against you: There are some among you who hold to the teaching of Balaam, who taught Balak to entice the Israelites to sin so that they ate food sacrificed to idols and committed sexual immorality. Likewise, you also have those who hold to the teaching of the Nicolaitans. Repent therefore! Otherwise, I will soon come to you and will fight against them with the sword of my mouth. Whoever has ears, let them hear what the Spirit says to the churches. To the one who is victorious, I will give some of the hidden manna. I will also give that person a white stone with a new name written on it, known only to the one who receives it.

Jesus Writes To A Confused Church In Pergamum:

Our confusion grows out of our relationships

How do we clear up confusion in our lives?

1) Respect The Authority Of God's Word

In His right hand He held seven stars, and out of His mouth came a sharp double-edged sword. His face was like the sun shining in all its brilliance - Revelation 1:16 (NIV)

For the Word of God is living and active. Sharper than any double-edged sword, it penetrates even to dividing soul and spirit, joints and marrow; it judges the thoughts and attitudes of the heart

- Hebrews 4:12 (NIV)

2) Recognize The Danger Of A Lie

Past actions of faith cannot protect us from the power of a lie.

- Satan's throne warns us of the popular lie (Rev. 2:13)
- The Balaamites warn us of the pleasure lie. (Rev. 2:14)
- The Nicolaitans warn us of the personality-centered lie. (Rev. 2:15)

All three warn us that lies make their ways into our lives through relationships.

3) Repent From Encouraging False Teaching

Anyone who has a different teaching does not agree with the true teaching of our Lord Jesus Christ and the teaching that shows the true way to serve God. This person is full of pride and understands nothing, but is sick with a love for arguing and fighting about words. This brings jealousy, fighting, speaking against others, evil mistrust, and constant quarrels... - 1 Timothy 6:5 (NCV)

But avoid foolish controversies and genealogies and arguments and quarrels about the law, because these are unprofitable and useless. Warn a divisive person once, and then warn him a second time. After that, have nothing to do with him - Titus 3:9-10 (NIV)

4) Rejoice In My Relationship With Christ
