## Right in the Eye Part 3—When A Woman Leads

Judges 4:1—¹After Ehud's death, <u>the Israelites again did evil</u> in the Lord's sight. (NLT)

Judges 4:2—2So the Lord turned them over to <u>King Jabin</u> of Hazor, a Canaanite king. The commander of his army was <u>Sisera</u>, who lived in Harosheth-haggoyim. (NLT)

Judges 4:3a—3<u>Sisera</u>, who had 900 iron chariots, <u>ruthlessly oppressed</u> the Israelites for twenty years . . . (NLT)

Judges 4:3b-5—3... Then the people of Israel cried out to the Lord for help. <sup>4</sup><u>Deborah</u>, the wife of Lappidoth, was a prophet who was judging Israel at that time. <sup>5</sup>She would sit under the Palm of Deborah, between Ramah and Bethel in the hill country of Ephraim, and the Israelites would go to her for judgment. (NLT)

Judges 4:6-7—6She summoned <u>Barak</u> son of Abinoam from Kedesh in Naphtali and said to him, "<u>Hasn't the Lord, the God of Israel, commanded you: 'Go,</u> deploy the troops on Mount Tabor, and take with you <u>10,000 men</u> from the Naphtalites and Zebulunites? <sup>7</sup>Then <u>I will lure Sisera</u> commander of Jabin's forces, his chariots, and his army at the <u>Wadi Kishon</u> to fight against you, and <u>I will hand him over to you.</u>" (HCSB)

Judges 4:8-9—8Barak told her, "I will go, but <u>only if you go with me</u>." "Very well," she replied, "<u>I will go with you. But you will receive no honor</u> in this venture, for the Lord's victory over Sisera will be at the hands of a woman." So <u>Deborah went with Barak</u> to Kedesh. (NLT)

Judges 4:14-16—<sup>14</sup>Then Deborah said to Barak, "<u>Get ready</u>! This is the day <u>the Lord will give you victory</u> over Sisera, for the Lord is marching ahead of you." So Barak led his 10,000 warriors down the slopes of Mount Tabor into battle. <sup>15</sup>When Barak attacked, the <u>Lord threw Sisera and all his chariots and warriors into a panic</u>. Sisera leaped down from his chariot and escaped on foot. <sup>16</sup>Then

Barak chased the chariots and the enemy army all the way to Harosheth-haggoyim, killing all of Sisera's warriors. Not a single one was left alive. (NLT)

Judges 4:18-21—18 Meanwhile, Sisera ran to the tent of <u>Jael, the</u> <u>wife of Heber the Kenite</u>, because Heber's family was on friendly terms with King Jabin of Hazor. Jael went out to meet Sisera and said to him, "<u>Come into my tent, sir. Come in. Don't be afraid</u>." So he went into her tent, and she covered him with a blanket.

19 "Please give me some water," he said, "I'm thirsty." So she gave him some milk from a leather bag and covered him again. <sup>20</sup> "Stand at the door of the tent, "he told her. "If anybody comes and asks you if there is anyone here, say no." <sup>21</sup>But <u>when Sisera fell asleep from exhaustion, Jael quietly crept up to him and with a hammer and tent peg</u> in her hand. Then <u>she drove the tent peg through his</u> temple and into the ground, and so he died. (NLT)

Judges 4:23-24—23So <u>on that day Israel saw God defeat Jabin</u>, the Canaanite king. <sup>24</sup>And from that time on <u>Israel became stronger</u> <u>and stronger</u> against King Jabin until they finally destroyed him. (NLT)
