

GLIMPSES OF JESUS IN THE OLD TESTAMENT

Esther

Week 10 | Esther 4:1-17

All throughout the Old Testament, we see story after story of faithful yet flawed men and women whose lives reflect glimpses of the **glory** of the coming King, Jesus Christ.

The story of Esther takes place after Babylon, Israel's captor, was invaded and defeated by the Persians. The Persian King Cyrus allowed the Jews to return to Judah; and not only that, but he helped to fund and support the rebuilding of the temple. However, when Cyrus set the Jews free, they did not all return home. The book takes place in Susa, one of Persia's capital cities, where there remained a significant Jewish population, including Esther. During this time, King Ahasuerus was convinced by his advisor Haman to put an end to the remaining Jewish population in the King's domain. But unbeknownst to Ahasuerus or Haman, Ahasuerus's new wife, Esther, was herself Jewish; and providentially, she was therefore given a critical and unique opportunity to speak to the king on behalf of the Jews.
