





Not because you have proven yourself worthy, but because grace makes you ready. Not because you are without weakness, but because God's grace is made perfect in our weakness.



Let's Get Going

God the Holy Spirit fulfills the work of reconciliation in human life. The Holy Spirit creates and renews the Church as the community where people are reconciled to God and to one another.

The Spirit enables us to receive forgiveness as we forgive one another, and to enjoy the peace of God as we make peace among ourselves.

In spite of our sin, the Spirit gives us power to become representatives of Jesus Christ and his gospel of reconciliation to all people.

Nevertheless, as we mature in love and faithfulness with Christ, we live in freedom and good cheer, bearing witness on good days and evil days, confident that the new life is pleasing to God and helpful to others.



## The Confession of 1967 - United Presbyterian Church

This was written during the troubled 1960's and the civil rights movement in response to civil religion. Its central doctrines include reconciliation and the equality of all persons. Banner: The Blue, Red and Gold: Colors of the official seal of the United Presbyterian Church in the United States of America; The Golden, Down-reaching Hand: (repeated from the Nicene Banner) God reaching down to his world; The Crown (repeated from the Westminster Banner) and the Nail Scarred Hand: The death and victory of Christ; The Four Hands of Different Colors, the Clasped Hands, and the Green Circle: The reconciled world at the foot of the cross; The Stars and Planets on the Blue Background: The Space-Age Setting of this confession.






