## DISCUSSION QUESTIONS | FEBRUARY 15TH

1. In verses 22-24, Jesus sends the disciples into the boat, and the storm comes while they are obeying Him. What does the text show about who initiated this moment and who remains sovereign over it? How does that challenge the assumption that obedience always leads to calm circumstances?
2. In verses 28-29, Peter asks to come to Jesus on the water. What do you notice about Peter's request and Jesus' simple command, "Come"? What does this interaction reveal about faith—not as self-confidence, but as response to Christ's word?
3. Read verse 30 again. According to the text, what changed? What exactly changes in Peter between walking and sinking?
4. One of the points Pastor Tyson mentioned was that we often overestimate what we can do and underestimate what God can do. Where in your life are you tempted to rely on your own strength, competence, or control instead of trusting Christ? How has that shown up recently?
5. In verses 31-33, Jesus immediately reaches out His hand and takes hold of Peter. What does this moment reveal about our lack of control and our need for a Savior? How does seeing Jesus as the One who rescues, not just the One who commands, reshape the way you face distraction, fear, or failure right now?
