DISCUSSION QUESTIONS | MAY 24TH

- 1.(Get to know you question) -- What's something you've enjoyed lately that's brought a surprising amount of joy or refreshment to your life?
- 2.In Psalm 73:2-3, Asaph admits that his feet had "almost stumbled" because he envied the wicked. What specifically was he envying, and why was it such a temptation for him?
- 3.Throughout the Psalm, Asaph wrestles with the seeming prosperity and ease of those far from God. Have you ever been tempted to look at someone else's life and wonder if following the Lord is really worth it? Describe
- 4.Everything begins to shift for Asaph in verse 17 when he enters the sanctuary of God. What changes in his perspective there? What does that reveal about how worship and nearness to God reshape our hearts?
- 5.In verses 25-26, Asaph says, "Whom have I in heaven but you?... God is the strength of my heart and my portion forever." How does someone move from envy to actually treasuring God like that?
- 6.Pastor Jon connected Psalm 73 with Philippians 3 and the "one thing" mentality of knowing Christ. What competes most for your affection and attention right now? What would it look like for Jesus to truly become your greatest treasure?
