Lack of Happiness

Life of Happiness

The word Jesus uses for blessed, is the greek work Makarios - meaning happy, satisfied, fortunate.

The life Jesus describes is not one defined by circumstances

Money can't buy happiness.

Age has nothing to do with happiness

Climate has nothing to do with happiness

Education has nothing to do with happiness

Circumstances have nothing to do with happiness

Happiness fundamentally is something that happens inside of you and not just something that happens outside of you.
