Memory Verse:

Hebrews 2:10-11 CSB

10 For in bringing many sons and daughters to glory, it was entirely appropriate that God—for whom and through whom all things exist—should make the pioneer of their salvation perfect through sufferings. 11 For the one who sanctifies and those who are sanctified all have one Father. That is why Jesus is not ashamed to call them brothers and sisters

Why did God give us scripture?

READ: Hebrews 2:5-18

This passage speaks to an emerging heresy within the church, which would ultimately become even more popular and deceive many. Is that something we need to worry about today?

Read: 2 Peter 2:1, Acts 17:11, 2 Corinthians 11:14-15, Acts 2:42-47, 2 Timothy 4:3-4, 1 Timothy 6:3-5, 1 Timothy 4:16, 2 Timothy 1:13, 2 Timothy 3:16-17

Matthew 16:24-25 CSB

24 Then Jesus said to his disciples, “If anyone wants to follow after me, let him deny himself, take up his cross, and follow me. 25 For whoever wants to save his life will lose it, but whoever loses his life because of me will find it.

What does this verse mean in real life for us today?
