Read: Colossians 1:1-4

holy and dearly loved,

When God looks upon His children (that is all believers) he sees them as holy (set apart for His glory) and dearly loved. How might internalizing this fact help someone have healthier relationships?

clothe yourselves with compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness and patience.

What might it look like to clothe yourself with these characteristics? How might this affect us in regards to spiritual warfare? (Eph 6)

What role does forgiveness, or a lack of it, play in healthy relationships?

Does faking it count? Why or why not?

14 And over all these virtues put on love, which binds them all together in perfect unity.

John 13:34-35 CSB

34 "I give you a new command: Love one another. Just as I have loved you, you are also to love one another. **35** By this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you love one another."
