



LP Family Christmas - Go Tell It

OK you are a shepherd in Bethlehem, you have just heard the angels proclamation, and are on the way to see Jesus. You can text one person about this, but you can only use emoji's to communicate what happened. Which ones would you use?

Read: Luke 2:8-20, Micah 4:6-8

These shepherds were likely the Shepherd of Migdal Eder, who kept the Tower of the Flock. After 400 years of silence, how seriously do you think they took the prophecy in Micah 4:6-8 that they would be the first to hear the news of the Messiah? Do you think it affected their daily lives?

Read: Matthew 24:14, Matthew 24:34-36, Luke 21:34-36, John 14:1-3, Titus 2:11-14, James 5:7

Prophecy concerning the Second Coming of Christ outnumbers references to the first coming 8 to 1. (There are 1,845 Biblical references to the Second Coming). How do those words influence us today?

Is evangelism necessary? Why or why not?

The Shepherds lived with a Gospel urgency after hearing from the angels. What does that mean?

How does Gospel urgency express itself in the life of our church?

How can we live with a stronger sense of Gospel urgency in our lives everyday?

In what ways can we be so overzealous that it turns people off to the Gospel?
Should we worry about crossing that line or not?

What is the most amazing thing you have ever seen God do? How many people have you told that story?

Are you hesitant to share your testimony? If so why? What can be done to overcome that?

What is the difference between giving God glory and giving Him praise?

How do you practice giving God glory in your daily life?

As a LifeGroup, take some time to pray for people in your life that need Jesus, use their first names. Ask God to give each of you a passion and Gospel urgency to see them come to faith in Christ.
