

OPEN

Have you ever left your house open only to return home hours later to discover that you left the front door open? What are the feelings that you have as you re-enter your house?

Jesus colorfully points out for us the exclusive nature of salvation by saying that He is “the door,” not “a door.” Furthermore, Jesus is not only our Shepherd who leads us into the “sheepfold,” but He is the only door by which we may enter and be saved

What happens to the sheep that enter the pen through Jesus?

Jesus is clearly talking about a spiritual idea in that He offers salvation to all who enter through Him in verse 9 and that is the means to becoming one of His sheep for whom He will care.


INTRODUCTION

find what they need: food, shelter, etc. as long as they enter through Him.

DIVE DEEPER

In these verses, Jesus refers to some people as thieves and robbers. The word thieves is *kleptes* in Greek. Robbers is *lestes*, the definition of these is “someone who is an embezzler.” These refer to the false teachers who cared less about instructing others and more about making money off of their students.

Look again at verse 10. We know the thief is Satan and His followers. What is his desire for the sheep?

He wants to steal, kill and destroy them.

What is the abundant life that Jesus seeks to offer in this passage?

This idea of abundant life is not in any sense materialistic or a promise for an easy life, even though there are evangelists that imply that. The abundance is about the life itself. It is a quality of life brought about because of the relationship with the Savior.

Do you trust that Jesus can and will give you the best life possible?

Are there areas in your life that can be further surrendered to His leading and guiding?
