

What does Jesus say about himself in John 6:35? What is the significance of this statement from Jesus?


With this statement, Jesus offers himself to human beings as God, as Yahweh, who gives life much as bread provides life. But Jesus gives eternal life.

What was significant about bread in Jesus' day?

In that day and age, bread was typical food for every meal. It was the necessary daily food at that time. Every meal every person would enjoy bread. For the king, the pauper, the rich, the poor, the young, the old, the male and the female, bread satisfied everyone.

What are some things we try to use to satisfy our longings?

It is easy to go wandering through the world and look for things that can't satisfy or give money toward stuff we

think will satisfy like a car, a home, a vacation, or whatever it is we're longing for.

What is so sad about v36?

The Galileans had participated in one of Jesus' greatest miracles, the feeding of a multitude, yet they had the gall to ask Him for still another sign which also seemed to be the practice of the Pharisees. They saw Him and His miracles and heard Him preach, and yet they didn't believe in Him.

DIVE DEEPER

Why did Jesus say He would not cast out those who came to Him?

It was because Jesus didn't come to do His "own will" but "the will" of His Father who "sent" Him "down from heaven."

How did Jesus carry out the Father's will in v 38?

Jesus has committed not only to receive but also to eternally preserve or keep every person "the Father...hath given" or drew to Him.

How else did Jesus keep the will of the father in v39?

Not only would Jesus forever hold or keep those whom the Father gave to Him, but He also would "raise it again at the last day." Of course, this refers to the resurrection of the body when Jesus returns to rapture the church
