## Major Events of Passion Week

Sunday-Triumphal Entry into Jerusalem

Monday-Jesus cleanses the temple

Tuesday- Jesus' authority challenged in the temple

-Jesus teaches in stories and confronts the Jewish leaders

-Greeks ask to see Jesus

-the Olivet Discourse

-Judas agrees to betray Jesus

Wednesday-the bible does not say what Jesus did this day; he probably remained in Bethany with disciples

Thursday-The Last Supper

-Jesus speaks to His disciples in the Upper Room

-Jesus struggles in Gethsemane

-Jesus betrayed and arrested

Friday -Jesus is tried by Jewish and Roman authorities and is denied by Peter

-Jesus is crucified

Sunday -Resurrection

### Approximate time on Friday of Holy Week

1:00 <i>a.m.</i>	Prayer and agony in Gethsemane (Matthew, Mark, Luke) Betrayal by Judas The arrest in the garden
2:00 <i>a.m.</i>	Preliminary inquiry in secret at the house of Annas (John 18:13-24)
3:00 <i>a.m.</i>	Irregular trial at the house of Caiaphas in the presence of priests, scribes, and elders (Matthew 26:57-68; Mark 14:53-64) First mocking by soldiers (Matthew, Mark, Luke)
5:00 <i>a.m.</i>	Formal meeting of Sanhedrin to confirm the capital sentence (Matthew 27:1; Luke 22:66-71; 23:50-51a) First examination before Pilate (John 18:28-38) Examination before Herod (Luke 23:7-10) Second mocking by Herod and his men (Luke 23:11)
6:30 <i>a.m.</i>	Second examination before Pilate and Pilate's judgment (John 18:39-19:16; all Gospels) The flogging (all Gospels) The third mocking by soldiers (John 19:1-3)

9:00 a.m. procession to Golgatha normally 2 days were to pass between sentencing and execution

12 noon the whole country became dark

3:00 p.m. Jesus died- at the same time in the temple the sacrificial lamb was killed
