Luke 4:1-13



The Temptation of Jesus

⁴ Then Jesus, full of the Holy Spirit, returned from the Jordan River. He was led by the Spirit in the wilderness, ² where he was tempted by the devil for forty days. Jesus ate nothing all that time and became very hungry. ³ Then the devil said to him, “If you are the Son of God, tell this stone to become a loaf of bread.” ⁴ But Jesus told him, “No! The Scriptures say, ‘People do not live by bread alone.’”

⁵ Then the devil took him up and revealed to him all the kingdoms of the world in a moment of time. ⁶ “I will give you the glory of these kingdoms and authority over them,” the devil said, “because they are mine to give to anyone I please. ⁷ I will give it all to you if you will worship me.”

⁸ Jesus replied, “The Scriptures say,

‘You must worship the Lord your God and serve only him.’”

⁹ Then the devil took him to Jerusalem, to the highest point of the Temple, and said, “If you are the Son of God, jump off! ¹⁰ For the Scriptures say,

‘He will order his angels to protect and guard you.

¹¹ And they will hold you up with their hands so you won’t even hurt your foot on a stone.’”

¹² Jesus responded, “The Scriptures also say, ‘You must not test the Lord your God.’”

¹³ When the devil had finished tempting Jesus, he left him until the next opportunity came.

Luke 4:1-13

- V.1 What and I full of?
- V.1-13 What we are full of flows from us.
- V.1-13, Ephesians 5:18-20 If Jesus had to be full of the Spirit to live in faithfulness to the Father, so too do we.

¹⁸ Don’t be drunk with wine, because that will ruin your life. Instead, be filled with the Holy Spirit, ¹⁹ singing psalms and hymns and spiritual songs among yourselves, and making music to the Lord in your hearts. ²⁰ And give thanks for everything to God the Father in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ.

Ephesians 5:18

- The Lord’s heart is that we walk full of Holy Spirit and WITH Holy Spirit just as Jesus did.

- No time to be drunk. I can't keep sipping Babylon's best and expect Kingdom consecration and blessing in my life.
- V.2 Sometimes Obedience means testing. All assignments are anointing, and will demand that we rest in our anointing from the Lord.
- Jesus is the second and LAST Adam, the faithful Son.

⁴⁵ The Scriptures tell us, "The first man, Adam, became a living person."⁴⁵ But the last Adam—that is, Christ—is a life-giving Spirit.⁴⁶ What comes first is the natural body, then the spiritual body comes later. ⁴⁷ Adam, the first man, was made from the dust of the earth, while Christ, the second man, came from heaven. ⁴⁸ Earthly people are like the earthly man, and heavenly people are like the heavenly man. ⁴⁹ Just as we are now like the earthly man, we will someday be like the heavenly man.⁵⁰ What I am saying, dear brothers and sisters, is that our physical bodies cannot inherit the Kingdom of God. These dying bodies cannot inherit what will last forever.⁵¹ But let me reveal to you a wonderful secret. We will not all die, but we will all be transformed! ⁵² It will happen in a moment, in the blink of an eye, when the last trumpet is blown. For when the trumpet sounds, those who have died will be raised to live forever. And we who are living will also be transformed. ⁵³ For our dying bodies must be transformed into bodies that will never die; our mortal bodies must be transformed into immortal bodies.⁵⁴ Then, when our dying bodies have been transformed into bodies that will never die, this Scripture will be fulfilled:

"Death is swallowed up in victory.
⁵⁵ O death, where is your victory?
 O death, where is your sting?"

⁵⁶ For sin is the sting that results in death, and the law gives sin its power. ⁵⁷ But thank God! He gives us victory over sin and death through our Lord Jesus Christ.⁵⁸ So, my dear brothers and sisters, be strong and immovable. Always work enthusiastically for the Lord, for you know that nothing you do for the Lord is ever useless.

1 Corinthians 15: 45-58

- V.1-13 **WHO JESUS IS DEFINES WHO WE ARE.** HIS VICTORY GRANTS US A LIFE THAT HE PROMISED US. MISUNDERSTANDING OR MISINTERPRETED VERSIONS OF JESUS WILL NOT FILL THE VOID WE ARE ALL SO DESPERATELY LOOKING TO HAVE FILLED.
- JESUS COULD NOT BE TEMPTED TO THE POINT OF INDULGENCE.
- V.1-13 The Word is a weapon, with faith in Christ, it is OUR weapon.
- V.4 My diet dictates and directs my where my authority comes from and is found in.
- V. 5 There is authority over the enemy and demonic in Jesus Christ alone. And this authority is not for us to abuse but for us to abide and remain intimate and close to the LORD.

- V. 13 The victory is one, but, there is still residual battles until He returns to rule. Don't let your guard down. Be watchful and mindful.
- Don't despise the wildernesses. They are anointed assignments that produce only what testing can do. Walk humbly out of the wilderness, because it is the Lord who delivers us from it.
