## TELL ME ABOUT HIS KINGSHIP

Mark 11:1-11



**BIG IDEA:** Jesus is worthy of worship because he is the King who came not to conquer by force, but to save through sacrifice.

# APPLICATION GUIDE

MARCH 29, 2026

## DISCUSS

When you hear the word “king,” what comes to mind—and how does that compare to what you see in Jesus in this passage?

## EXPLORE

In verses 1–6, what specific details show Jesus’ authority over the situation, and why are those details important?

How does Jesus’ choice to ride a colt (vv. 7–8) shape our understanding of what kind of King he is?

What are the people expressing when they shout “Hosanna” and quote Psalm 118 (vv. 9–10)? What do they get right—and what do they misunderstand?

Why does Jesus’ quiet inspection of the temple in verse 11 matter, and how does it prepare us for what happens next?

## APPLY

Where in your life are you struggling to trust Jesus’ sovereign authority over the details? What would it look like to submit that to him?

Do you tend to view Jesus more as powerful or approachable? How does his humility in this passage invite you to come to him differently?

When you ask Jesus for help, are you primarily asking him to change your circumstances—or to save you from your sin? Explain honestly.

How does the reality that Jesus both saves and judges shape the way you think about your worship and your walk with him?

## COMMIT

This week, worship Jesus as the King who saves you from your sins. Spend time in thankful meditation, confession, and worship.
