

# Home Group Discussion Questions

Read Philippians 4:10-13 out loud as a group.

1. As the Philippian church met Paul's needs, what opportunities do you have to meet the needs of people around you? How could those moments open doors for the gospel? Be specific and practical in your answers.
2. Paul states twice in this passage that he has learned to be content in every circumstance. What is required to learn something like this? What do you think God uses in our lives to teach us contentment and how have you seen that process (or resistance to it) in your own life?
3. 1 Timothy 6:6 says that godliness with contentment is great gain. How does this connect with Paul learning contentment? What makes contentment "great gain" rather than loss?
4. How do Paul's words in Philippians 3:7-16 connect with Philippians 4:10-13? From what you see in both the passage and Paul's life, what is the "secret" of contentment for a believer?
5. How does the context of this passage shape what Paul means in verse 13? How does this bring real hope to believers in everyday circumstances?
6. Who are you inviting to one of our Easter services or gatherings? Share their names, and spend time praying that God would draw them to repentance through His lovingkindness.
