SAILING INTO THE STORM (PART 1 OF 2)

Jonah 1:4-8

Understanding and dealing with the storms in life.

Review: The word of the Lord (we are listening) // The servant of the Lord (we are obedient) // The mission of the Lord (We are merciful) // The presence of the Lord (We are not alone)

Today:

I. GOD IS SOVEREIGN OVER THE STORM (JONAH 1:4)

1. This storm was supernatural and caused by God

- i. Whatever the cause of the storm, you can be sure that God is in control of the storm.
- i. <u>Matthew 8:24–27 (NKJV)</u> ²⁴ And suddenly a great tempest arose on the sea, so that the boat was covered with the waves. But He was asleep. ²⁵ Then His disciples came to Him and awoke Him, saying, "Lord, save us! We are perishing!" ²⁶ But He said to them, "Why are you fearful, O you of little faith?" Then He arose and rebuked the winds and the sea, and there was a great calm. ²⁷ So the men marveled, saying, "Who can this be, that even the winds and the sea obey Him?"
- ii. <u>Psalm 89:8–9 (NKJV)</u> ⁸ O Lord God of hosts, Who is mighty like You, O Lord? Your faithfulness also

surrounds You. ⁹ You rule the raging of the sea; When its waves rise, You still them.

2. God will care for you and get you through this.

i. <u>2 Corinthians 4:8–9 (NLT)</u> ⁸ We are pressed on every side by troubles, but we are not crushed. We are perplexed, but not driven to despair. ⁹ We are hunted down, but never abandoned by God. We get knocked down, but we are not destroyed.

II. DON'T STAY IN THE STORM! (JONAH 1:5-6)

- 1. By trusting in human methods and solutions (no God)
 - i. "Believe in yourself"
 - ii. <u>Jeremiah 17:5 (NKJV)</u> ⁵ Thus says the Lord: "Cursed is the man who trusts in man And makes flesh his strength, Whose heart departs from the Lord.
 - iii. <u>Psalm 20:7 (NKJV)</u> ⁷ Some trust in chariots, and some in horses; But we will remember the name of the Lord our God.
- 2. By Trusting in other spiritual or supernatural solutions (wrong god)
 - i. About a quarter of U.S. adults (27%) now say they think of themselves as spiritual but not religious, up 8 percentage points in five years, according to a Pew Research Center survey conducted.

ii. Eastern meditations, astrology, tarot cards, higher power, the force, etc

3. By going to sleep. Don't ignore the storm!

- i. This brings peace and rest but this is not the "peace" we want. It's temporary.
- ii. <u>1 Thessalonians 5:3–6 (NKJV)</u> ³ For when they say, "Peace and safety!" then sudden destruction comes upon them, as labor pains upon a pregnant woman. And they shall not escape. ⁴ But you, brethren, are not in darkness, so that this Day should overtake you as a thief. ⁵ You are all sons of light and sons of the day. We are not of the night nor of darkness. ⁶ Therefore let us not sleep, as others do, but let us watch and be sober.

III. WHAT IS THE CAUSE OF THE STORM? (JONAH 1:7-8)

- 1. You. The Bad decisions that you have made.
 - i. <u>Galatians 6:7–8 (NKJV)</u> ⁷ Do not be deceived, God is not mocked; for whatever a man sows, that he will also reap. ⁸ For he who sows to his flesh will of the flesh reap corruption, but he who sows to the Spirit will of the Spirit reap everlasting life.
 - ii. <u>Proverbs 22:8 (NKJV)</u> ⁸ He who sows iniquity will reap sorrow...
- 2. Others. The Bad decisions that others have made

- i. The sailors weren't to blame, Jonah was! Also, sometimes bad things just happen as a result of the fall. And, sometimes it's Satan who is doing it.
- ii. <u>Romans 5:12 (NKJV)</u> ¹² Therefore, just as through one man sin entered the world, and death through sin, and thus death spread to all men, because all sinned—
- iii. <u>Romans 8:21–22 (NKJV)</u> ²¹ because the creation itself also will be delivered from the bondage of corruption into the glorious liberty of the children of God. ²² For we know that the whole creation groans and labors with birth pangs together until now.
- iv. <u>1 Peter 5:8 (NKJV)</u> ⁸ Be sober, be vigilant; because your adversary the devil walks about like a roaring lion, seeking whom he may devour.
- 3. God. He is using this storm for our good or for the good of others
 - i. Remember, He is going to save a city with this storm
 - ii. Discipline: God speaking through the storm if we don't listen to his voice another way
 - iii. <u>Hebrews 12:5–6 (ESV)</u> ⁵ And have you forgotten the exhortation that addresses you as sons? "My son, do not regard lightly the discipline of the Lord, nor be weary when reproved by him. ⁶ For the Lord

- disciplines the one he loves, and chastises every son whom he receives."
- iv. "We can ignore even pleasure. But pain insists upon being attended to. God whispers to us in our pleasures, speaks in our conscience, but shouts in our pains: it is his megaphone to rouse a deaf world."
 C.S. Lewis, The Problem of Pain
- v. "God doesn't allow His children to sin successfully." Spurgeon
- vi. <u>Psalm 118:18 (ESV)</u> ¹⁸ The Lord has disciplined me severely, but he has not given me over to death.
- vii. 2 Corinthians 12:7–9 (ESV) ⁷ So to keep me from becoming conceited because of the surpassing greatness of the revelations, a thorn was given me in the flesh, a messenger of Satan to harass me, to keep me from becoming conceited. ⁸ Three times I pleaded with the Lord about this, that it should leave me. ⁹ But he said to me, "My grace is sufficient for you, for my power is made perfect in weakness." Therefore I will boast all the more gladly of my weaknesses, so that the power of Christ may rest upon me.
