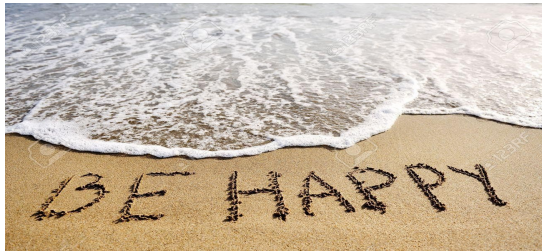

**HABITS: THE BIG SHOW**

**START**

*So Elijah went from there and found Elisha son of Shaphat. He was plowing with twelve yoke of oxen, and he himself was driving the twelfth pair. Elijah went up to him and threw his cloak around him.*

*Elisha then left his oxen and ran after Elijah. "Let me kiss my father and mother goodbye," he said, "and then I*

*will come with you.” “Go back,” Elijah replied. “What have I done to you?”*

*So Elisha left him and went back. He took his yoke of oxen and slaughtered them. He burned the plowing equipment to cook the meat and gave it to the people, and they ate. Then he set out to follow Elijah and became his servant. 1 Kings 19:19-20*

<sup>9</sup> *When they came to the other side, Elijah said to Elisha, “Tell me what I can do for you before I am taken away.” And Elisha replied, “Please let me inherit a double share of your spirit and become your successor.”*

<sup>10</sup> *“You have asked a difficult thing,” Elijah replied. “If you see me when I am taken from you, then you will get your request. But if not, then you won’t.”*

<sup>11</sup> *As they were walking along and talking, suddenly a chariot of fire appeared, drawn by horses of fire. It drove between the two men, separating them, and Elijah was carried by a whirlwind into heaven. <sup>12</sup> Elisha saw it and cried out, “My father! My father! I see the chariots and charioteers of Israel!” And as they disappeared from sight, Elisha tore his clothes in distress.*

<sup>13</sup> *Elisha picked up Elijah’s cloak, which had fallen when he was taken up. Then Elisha returned to the bank of the Jordan River. <sup>14</sup> He struck the water with Elijah’s cloak*

*and cried out, “Where is the Lord, the God of Elijah?”*

*Then the river divided, and Elisha went across.*
