LGBTQ+ - A Marriage of Convenience

- Until the 1980s Gay and Lesbian did not operate as a united coalition.
- Gays and Lesbians experienced different standings in the work place and differed on attitudes toward sexual activity.
 - The Coalition arose out of a shared sense of victimhood.
 - Lesbians and gays assume the importance of biological sexual differences.
 - In tension with this Lesbians set aside the importance of biology in order to present a common front against heteronormative society.

The Problem of the T

- LGB is incoherent with the T

“When my partner began his gender transition my lesbian identity had been central to my life and my sense of self for well over a decade, and I didn’t know what his transition made me. Some people told me I was obviously still a lesbian, but it was just as obvious to others that I was now straight, or bisexual. It wasn’t obvious to me at all, and I struggled with it for a long time. Now I’ve been the partner of a trans man for as long as I was a lesbian, and I’ve gotten comfortable just not having a name for what I think I am. I think of myself as part of the family of queers and trans people.”

Trans Ideology and Feminism

- Feminism is now bitterly divided between those who affirm trans women as true women and those who repudiate such.
- TERFs - Trans-Exclusionary Radical Feminists. While they may affirm that sex and gender are not the same thing. They would say that biology is still a vital part of being a woman because it shapes how women experience the world.

Sexual Orientation and Gender Identity

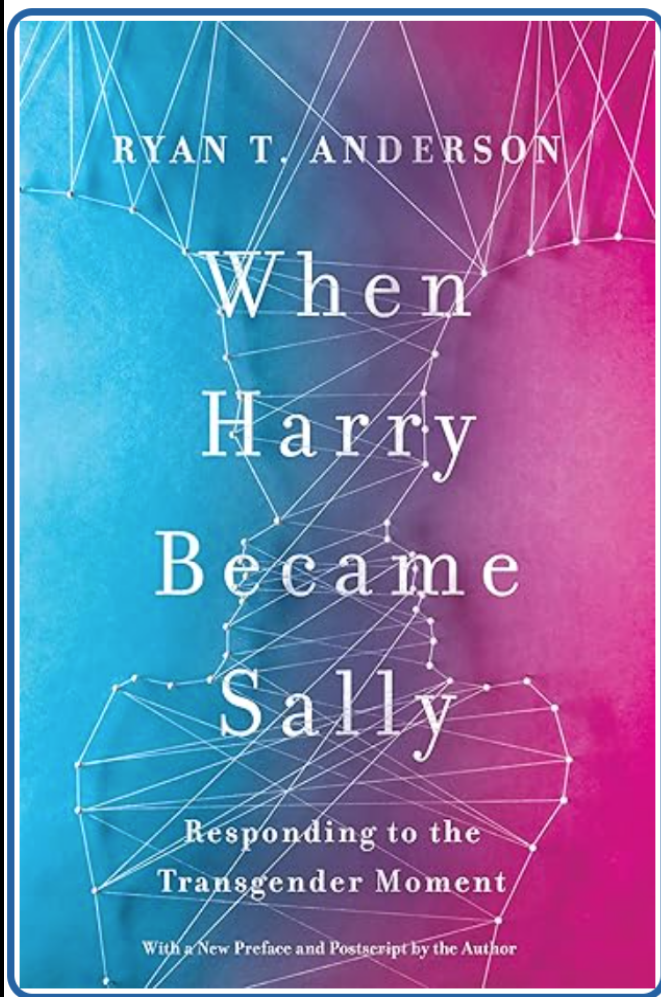
- The Yogyakarta Principles
 - Sexual Orientation and Gender Identity are integral to every person's dignity and humanity and must not be the basis for discrimination or abuse.
 - Society should affirm and protect whatever subjective sexual identity anyone cares to affirm for themselves.
 - Everyone has a right to found a family regardless of gender identity.
 - “These are the days when anything goes!”
